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Apply one of your completed novels to any ONE of the following ideas. Projects will be presented after school begins.

- 1. **Comic Summaries:** Use a storyboard/comic creator tool like Storyboard That to create a summary of the book. You may also hand draw a comic strip. Your storyboard should include a minimum of twelve frames.
- 2. **Video Commercial:** Create a video commercial for your book to persuade someone to read it. Carefully plan your commercial by creating a script before filming. Some ideas for video platforms include but are not limited to: iMovie, Windows Movie Maker, Flipgrid, WeVideo, Video Recorder, Pocket Video app, Apple Clips app or just use your device's main camera!
- 3. **Board Game:** Create a board game using the plot summary of your book. On the gameboard, you should include main characters, the setting, the conflict, and hint at the ending without spoiling the plot. Consider using a <u>virtual board game</u> maker as well. Your board game background should include elements of the setting of your book.
- 4. **Map:** Draw a map on a poster in which you feature key locations, houses, stores, neighborhoods, or other landmarks from your novel. Create symbols on your map of important events in your book. If a person went on a journey, map out and draw the route, marking key spots along the way. Consider using Google Drawings for this work.
- 5. **Picture Books**: Use Google Slides, PowerPoint, Book Creator or Shadow Puppet EDU, or paper to retell the story you read using only pictures. As you flip through the book you created, be ready to retell the story to any audience, possibly your younger SAA brothers.
