Duties/Responsibilities

- Assess, develop, and implement a reading support plan for developing readers
- Plan and conduct periodic evaluations to assess the need for changes in the reading program
- Plan and develop special reading projects as approved or provided
- Serve as a resource to the academic leadership team and faculty in areas of reading instruction and curriculum
- Assess reading referrals and make a determination of instructional needs of students pre-K 8th grade through collaboration with faculty
- Provide small group instruction to students
- Provide staff development in content area reading strategies
- Align, develop, and implement lesson plans that fulfill the requirements of the school's curriculum program and show written evidence of preparation
- Prepare lessons that reflect accommodations for differences in student learning styles

- Present subject matter according to guidelines established by the school
- Plan and use appropriate instructional and learning strategies, activities, materials, and equipment that reflect understanding of the learning styles and needs of students assigned
- Conduct assessment (formal and informal) of student learning styles and use results to plan instructional activities
- Participate in learning walks and visit other department/grade classrooms
- Communicate and promote implementation of SAA guidelines on grading practices, curriculum, assessments, and instructional strategies
- Participate and plan in department and grade level meetings and maintain professional competence through in-service education activities provided by professional growth activities
- Supervise students in out-of-classroom activities during the school day
- Communicate with parents through conferences and other means to discuss students' progress
- Use technology in the teaching/learning process
- Assist in the selection of books, equipment, and other instructional materials
- Demonstrate behavior that is professional, ethical, and responsible
- Keep informed of and comply with school regulations and policies
